WHY THIS WEBSITE?

- This website, wisopoidabatement.com was created as a repository of information and resources for counties as they begin the process of determining how to best invest settlement funds.
- It is the Association's hope that the materials on the website serve counties this year and for years to come as additional settlement funds become available.

WHY THIS WEBSITE?

- The beauty of the court-sanctioned “approved uses” list in terms of abatement activities that are an allowed use of settlement funds is its breadth – there are multiple categories of approved uses. But the flexibility of the approved uses list also presents challenges – where does a county start to determine the best way to invest in abatement?
